## God calls us to worship

from John 1:29; Isaiah 53:4; Psalm 103:4


Liturgist: Our help is in the name of the Lord, the Suffering Servant, All: the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world,

Liturgist: who has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows,

who redeems our life from the pit

and crowns us with steadfast love and mercy.

## We pray for God to help us worship

Liturgist: Christ is risen!

All: He is risen indeed!

He died for us that we might live for him.

#### God calls us to confess our sin

from Hebrews 2:17-18; 4:16

Liturgist: Christ was made like us in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself has suffered when tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

#### We confess our sin

All (sing): stanzas 1-2 of "Psalm 32" (below)

All: God our Creator,

we confess that we have all sinned and come short of your glory.

We have neglected the worship you deserve,

but we have given our worship to created things.

We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves,

but we have treated them unjustly.

We have not trusted your promise and power to save us,

but we have lived in fear as if you are no hope at all, as if you were not a God of steadfast love and mercy.

Father, have mercy on us.

(silent prayers of confession)


Liturgist: Father, we are sorry for all the ways that we have dishonored you.

### God declares our forgiveness

from Romans 8:31-32; Colossians 1:12-14

Liturgist:

If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? God the Father has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.



#### God feeds us at his table




Bread: The bread is gluten-free.

**Prayer for those searching:** Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Help me to be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent and convincing and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

**Prayer of new belief:** Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared believe, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness.
