from Isaiah 30:15, 18

Liturgist: For thus said the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel, "In repentance and rest you shall be

> saved; in quietness and in trust shall be your strength." The Lord waits to be gracious to you, and therefore he exalts himself to show mercy to you. For the Lord is a God of

justice; blessed are all who wait for him.

We confess our sin

All (sing): Trisagion (below); sing 3 times

Liturgist: Sovereign Lord, you are faithful to deliver all who call on you.

All: But we have sought security

in our own strategies and strength

and in powers that oppose your kingdom

but cannot save or satisfy.

Liturgist: You have made us citizens of your heavenly kingdom,

and you rightly deserve our greatest trust.

All: But we often turn away from you

and seek comfort in addictions that enslave us

because we do not trust you.

So we surrender to the sinful ways of our culture.

Its images capture our imaginations,

its messages fill our minds,

and its customs guide our choices.

Lord, have mercy on us.

(silent prayers of confession)

Liturgist: Father, forgive us for surrendering so easily to seductive idols and illusions that cannot

save. By your Spirit, lead us to wait upon you and cry out to you so that we will find strength to stand in our weariness, faith to trust your goodness in our confusion, and

grace to help in our time of need.

All (sing): Trisagion (below); sing 1 time



STANDING (IF ABLE)

God declares our forgiveness

from Psalm 103:8, 10-12

Liturgist: The Lord is merciful and gracious,

slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. He does not deal with us according to our sins,

nor repay us according to our iniquities.

For as high as the heavens are above the earth,

so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him;

as far as the east is from the west,

so far does he remove our transgressions from us.

For all who have turned from sin in sorrow and look to God for mercy, this is God's gift.

In Jesus Christ, God loves you, God forgives you, God accepts you,

and God rejoices over you as beloved daughters and sons.
