God calls us to confess our sin

from Hebrews 2:17-18; 4:16

Liturgist:

Christ was made like us in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself has suffered when tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

We confess our sin

All (sing): stanzas 1 and 2 of "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" (below)

Liturgist: Sovereign Lord, you have chosen us in love

so that we will walk in the light of your love forever.

All: But we forget your favor and steadfast love

and seek to quench our deepest longings

Liturgist: You have chosen us to fill us with the glory of your Son

so that we will enjoy the riches of your majesty and life forever.

All: But we think too little of your eternal glory.

We grasp for life and glory in weak things that pass away, and we make so little time for eternal joys that please you,

loving your people and giving away our lives to share your glory for the good of others.

(silent prayers of confession)

Liturgist: Father, open our eyes to behold your glory. Satisfy our hearts with delight in your glory.

Forgive us for wasting your gifts, forgetting your love, and forsaking your kingdom.

Fill us with the joy that comes only from Jesus, so that we seek your glory in loving your

people and gladly giving our lives to the mission of our King.

All (sing): stanza 3 of "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" (below)

God declares our forgiveness

from Hebrews 2:7, 9, 11

Liturgist:

God created us a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned us with glory and honor in Christ, the Son of Man, because by the grace of God he suffered death for us. Therefore, he is not ashamed to call us brothers and sisters.

and God rejoices over you as beloved daughters and sons.




