God calls us to worship

from Revelation 1:6; Psalm 106:1

God calls us to confess our sin

from Isaiah 30:15, 18

Liturgist: For thus says the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel, "In repentance and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and in trust shall be your strength." The Lord waits to be gracious to you, and therefore he exalts himself to show mercy to you. For the Lord is a God of justice; blessed are all who wait for him.

We confess our sin



Liturgist: Our gracious Father, it is easy for us

to believe lies about you and about ourselves. We often think too little of your love and mercy

and too highly of ourselves.

All: We fear that you love us only if we are good enough.

We are prone to believe that you accept us only if our morality merits your favor and only if our performance earns your praise.

We are prone to credit ourselves when we do what is right. When we do wrong, we deal with our guilt and shame by offering you our own flawed record to earn a reward rather than humbly offering to you our need and receiving and resting in the gift of your love, the righteousness of Christ our Savior for us.

Lord, have mercy on us.

(silent prayers of confession)

Liturgist: Gracious Father, forgive us for believing lies about your love and our goodness.

Lord, help us to cast all our guilt and shame upon you continually and to live each day with confident knowledge that our sins are freely and fully forgiven in Christ, that we are united to you in Christ only as a gift of your strong Fatherly love, and that your steadfast love for us as your beloved children endures forever.

Liturgist:





God feeds us at his table




Bread: The bread is gluten-free.
