There's a storm brewing on the horizon, but there's no need to rush to the store for bread and milk. No, as we near Easter it's once again time for Spring Storm, KidCentral's annual retreat. A rite of passage for more than 20 years for kids in grades 4-6, Spring Storm is one of Central's most enduring ministries.

Even for some campers who may have already heard ARE the Good News many times, Spring Storm 202 represents the first time they are doing so away from their family. It is not at all uncommon to witness new professions of faith!

Serving our kids as a counselor can be hard work. Long days, an unfamiliar bed, and a cabin filled with enthusiastic 5th graders can be a challenge. However, every year you hear counselors comment on how their own faith has been renewed or strengthened by the experience. Long-time volunteer and worship leader Pete Johnson summarizes the adults' experience well:

"Spring Storm is one of the highlights of my year. It is a kind of 'controlled chaos' that God uses to unsettle me, and then, through that awkward vulnerability, enables me to relate to the kids (as they are often experiencing the same thing!). The task is ALWAYS too big, but God ALWAYS shows up and shows me this is HIS weekend! Kids are touched by his love, and the staff and volunteers are strengthened by witnessing God's power at work through their weakness."

Pulling of an event of this scale is no easy task. Each year, more than 120 campers are ministered to by at least 40 adult and high school volunteers. Add-in a full worship band, arts and crafts supplies, materials for a variety of games and contests, and it takes a large trailer just to get all the supplies for the weekend delivered to the retreat!

This year, all that gear will once again be heading

to Lake Williamson Christian Center in Carlinville, IL. This is the second year in a row we have held Spring Storm at Lake Williamson, and it offers a great environment for the kids. The facility we use for worship and our large

worship and our largegroup discussions is spacious, the food is plentiful, and there's a lot of room and options for the kids to burn off energy.

Spring Storm 2015, "The Amazing Chase," will be April 17-19. Our featured speaker this year is Central's own Jeremy Blythe, Director of Student Ministries. Jeremy will be helping the campers discover about the character and activity of God, and how he can use anybody to accomplish his purposes of redeeming all things and calling them to himself.
