GOD IS MOVING IN

This past February and March, Central took their eighth mission trip to Iraq to work with refugees, government officials, church leaders and the Peshmerga army. They took relief, Bibles and an encouraging message of the hope of Christ, to this troubled nation.

Our missionary, Jamal, his son, Fadi, and Randy went a week before the rest of the team, during which time Randy performed in two outreach concerts with a local Kurdish orchestra. He also had opportunities to share his faith with members of the orchestra. One of the concerts was even carried live on Kurdish TV.

Randy was joined by Central elder, Larry Kindbom, the head football coach at Washington University in St. Louis. Larry led an American football camp for refugee kids for two nights and he was interviewed for local television about the camp and his work in Iraq. Randy and Larry were joined by David Harden, a college friend of Randy's from Washington, DC. It was a great trip and God moved even in the midst of war and turmoil in that area. The team met with members of Parliament and talked about the desire for the Kurds to become an independent state in order to remain free and to continue to work with and help the minority religions (Christianity, Jewish, Yazidi and others.) They preached in a local Kurdish church and met with the heads of the Muslim, Jewish and Christian ministries who are working together against ISIS and to support the minority religious groups.

Here's a testimony from Larry Kindbom about his time in Iraq:

I love my Lord. I love people. I love football. I felt the Lord had called me to Iraq on a mission trip to serve him. I did not know what help I could give, but I knew the Lord had called me for a reason. ... It was fun to see people who had never thrown a spiral or run a pass route, much less seen or touched a football. By the time the session ended, we had the groups clapping hands, breaking down, and pointing to the sky on command, shouting "In Him."

My greatest question before I went was "How does one share his faith in Jesus Christ with a Muslim in the Middle East?" ... But with each group that we met, from the refugees to the members of Parliament to the Army generals, came an affirming statement. "Christians are the ones who have stepped forward and helped us, supported us, and loved us. Even our own people do not share the same support." We saw smiles and trust forming

as we sat down with them and let them share their stories. They felt our love and caring, and almost all of them took an Arabic or Kurdish Bible. ... Those who supported
